

Online Safety



Intent:

The education of pupils in Online Safety, Digital Wellbeing and Digital Literacy is an essential part of our online safety provision. We prepare pupils with the skills to access lifelong learning, whilst developing their awareness to the potential risks. We aim to empower and educate pupils in their use of technology to equip them to be responsible digital citizens, who remain both safe and legal when using the Internet and related technologies, inside and beyond the context of the classroom.

The Curriculum in Subject:

- Whole school overview of Online Safety & Digital Wellbeing
- At the beginning of every half term, Online Safety sessions are covered
- Schemes of work used for discrete Online Safety sessions
- Schemes of learning used for Years 3, 4, 5 and 6: Google Internet Legends and Google Digital Wellbeing.
- Schemes of learning used for Reception, Year 1 and Year 2: Purple Mash
- Online Safety, Digital Wellbeing and Digital Literacy is covered across the curriculum and discrete sessions are used to teach the key knowledge and understanding.
- Key messages of Online Safety & Digital Wellbeing are covered across the curriculum when relevant opportunities arise.

2. Continue to embed across the curriculum to ensure confident digital citizens
3. Opportunities to share knowledge to an audience
