Dear Parent(s)/Guardian(s)

Welcome to the Summer term!

This term, we are beginning another exciting new topic for Reception, as part of the whole school's focus on "Peace, Justice and Equality". The theme for Reception in half term one is Getting Along and Fairness, and in the second half term we will be delving into Parkdale in the Past! We will be thinking about fairness, sharing, differences and resolving conflicts. We will investigate what school was like for children at the time of Parkdale's opening in 1929 and compare it to now. Many areas of the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum are being taught through this theme, whereas others are taught discretely. We are also hoping to take the classes on an exciting trip to Wollaton Park. This is provisionally booked for the 13th of June. We will provide more details as soon as possible!

We have some exciting activities planned and would really appreciate your support with some of these. Sharing and reading Traditional Tales, and talking about how the characters behave, at home, will help build children's confidence when talking about stories and emotions. In the second half term we will be challenging children to have a go at baking and making simple snacks.

During the term we will be setting the following homework (guide timings are in brackets):

- Daily reading (10 minutes per night)
- Activities "2-do" on Purple Mash.
- Drawing in your sketch book.

Reading and Homework

The most important thing that you can do to support your child with their progress in Reception is to hear them read and to share books with them. Children who read their reading book approximately four times a week develop their confidence, fluency and are able to become more independent in their learning. Listening to a bedtime story is so important to maintain a love of books and reading. We appreciate this feels time consuming but just reading two pages a day, is more effective than trying to read their whole reading book once a week. We ask you to sign their diary to say that you have











seen them read or have read to them. You may also wish to make a comment about their progress.

Our second 'homework' request is that you continue to use the Drawing Challenge books we have sent home and share them with us on Tapestry. We are so impressed with the continued progress in their fine motor skills through our skills time and these drawing jobs will help to continue the development of these skills.

We also continue to offer a variety of online learning platforms that you may want to explore with your child. These are not compulsory in Reception but can help you understand what your child is learning and how they are doing.
