Y6 Trip: National Galleries of Justice Museum

As part of our theme, 'Identity', we have scheduled a trip for Y6 to go to The National Galleries Of Justice Museum in Nottingham City Centre on **Tuesday 21st November**. This trip links closely with one of our sub-topics, which includes learning about democracy, politics and the Suffragettes.

The sessions which we will be enjoying include a practical trial in a courtroom experience named 'Court in the Past: Suffragettes' and a museum experience tour named 'Crime and Punishment Through Time'. During the museum experience pupils will explore 'law-related objects and artefacts from the collection, engage with costumed interpreter's, hear about historical changes in the prison system and visit key museum spaces including the dungeons, exercise yard, debtor's cell, punishment corridor and criminal courtroom!'

In previous years, our Y6 pupils really enjoyed this trip as it was a practical and enjoyable day with lots of opportunities for collaboration, discussion and historical based enquiry.

Our day at the museum begins at 10am so we will be departing school promptly at 9am. Our sessions are planned to finish at 2:30pm. We envisage the return journey may take slightly longer due to school traffic so we should be back at school by 3.30pm. School will contact you if we encounter an unexpected delay. The cost for the trip is £10.85. This is to cover the cost of the workshops at the museum and transport. The trip will be at a reduced cost for children in receipt of the Pupil Premium.
