Kwik Cricket

Kwik Cricket was originally launched in 1988 and is a fully inclusive format of the game played in schools where the emphasis is on participation and enjoyment. It is specially tailored for children up to the age of 11. The equipment is made from lightweight, durable plastic and is designed specifically for use with children between the ages of 5 and 11. The emphasis on Kwik Cricket should always be on participation and enjoyment. In practice, any number of children can play, from 2 to 32.

Cricket at Parkdale

We aim to promote the national Summer sport and create a 'culture of cricket' We believe cricket is a great game for all ages. And that no one is too young to start to learn basic skills.

We all start to learn cricket skills from Reception onwards.

By Years 5 and 6, some of our children choose to play hard-ball cricket at after school club. We have invested in facilities for this; artificial wickets, a batting net, bowling machine, all the kit — which is rare for a State Primary School!



The basics...

The are two teams of 8 players

Batters bat in pairs for two overs each—an over is 6 balls

Teams start with 200 runs.

Bowlers are encouraged to bowl overarm

Batters may be out bowled, caught, run-out , hit-wicket or stumped

5 runs are deducted if a player is given out.

There is no LBW

Runs are scored in the normal way

Umpires are generous with wides—a wide is generally just anything off the pitch!

Similarly, no balls. Umpires will decide if the delivery could have been hit, even if it rolls or bounces multiple times. Deliveries above waist high are no balls.

2 runs are awarded for a wide or no ball. They are not re-bowled except in the final over of an innings.

Batters may take additional runs off a no ball or wide.

The team with the higher score wins

In the event of a tie, the team taking the most wickets wins
