This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

Curriculum Access and Allocation: We publish our music curriculum for each year group online, detailing how we increase access for disabled pupils and support SEND students. Our curriculum information specifies the weekly time allocation for music education per key stage and term or half-term of the academic year. Guidance and Opportunities: Our music curriculum follows the model music curriculum (March 2021). We offer opportunities for pupils to learn singing or instrument playing during lessons, including whole-class ensemble teaching.

Partnerships and Support: We collaborate with Nottinghamshire Music Hub to enhance our music program and provide additional support for our students.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

Music Tuition Options: Our school offers a range of music tuition outside lesson time, including small-group and large-group sessions for both instrumental and vocal training. This includes tuition for Drumming and free ukulele small group lessons. We hope to increase these options over the next two years.

Ensembles and Music Groups: Pupils can join our free KS2 choir club which runs all year and joins together with other Transform Trust schools for performances and an annual ensemble. We will be taking a choir to Young Voices in January 2026. We also have free brass lessons led by our Inspire music specialist.

Progression and Opportunities: Pupils can advance in music through small group trumpet sessions from Inspire Music and drumming lessons with DCP Drumming. The school also benefits from partnerships with the local music hub and we aim to develop this link over the next two years to link with other music education organisations to support co-curricular music activities.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

Planned Musical Experiences: The academic year includes regular musical activities such as weekly singing in assemblies, termly school music celebrations, annual Christmas concerts, and good work assemblies, along with trips to external concerts and theatre performances. These events are designed to involve pupils from various year groups either as participants or audience members.

Participation and Support: The school collaborates with local music hubs and music education organisations to enhance these musical experiences. These include opportunities to perform in cross-trust events such as bi-annual Performing Arts Festivals and the yearly Transform Choir performance.

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

Planned Improvements: Future plans include enhancing curriculum music by ensuring that staff continue to receive music CPD to aid the teaching of music across the school, to provide all pupils the opportunity to enjoy a live performance each year, and to increase opportunities for pupils to perform on musical instruments to an audience and parents. We will take a choir to Young Voices for the second year running in January 2026. We aim to provide free trumpet lessons and to raise the profile of our DCP Drumming lessons with workshops throughout KS1 and KS2. In addition, we will offer a weekly nurture music group where some pupils will receive instrument tuition designed to support their wellbeing and build confidence. These changes aim to align with the 7 features of high-quality music provision.

Implementation Timeline: Specific improvements are scheduled for phased introduction in the coming years, with timelines for each initiative to ensure a structured and effective enhancement of music education and experiences. More information about the improvements can be obtained from the school.
